尼克森總統訪問我們國家——

1972 年,北京與華盛頓的熊貓外交,隨著尼克森總統對中國的歷史性訪問開始。中國共產黨的創始人毛澤東贈送了兩隻熊貓給美國,這是在幾十年的外交冰封後雙邊關係暖化的象徵。

第一夫人帕特·尼克森歡迎熊貓來到華盛頓。

她們將被來自全國各地的數百萬人民所喜愛。

看到大熊貓在美國人中的受歡迎程度上升,中國將更多大熊貓送往美國各地的動物園,最終改為租借而非贈送。2011年中國與國家動物園之間的協議規定,所有大熊貓及其後代的所有權屬於中國。合約還要求每年向中國支付50萬美元,用於中國境內大熊貓的保育工作。

在最高峰時,美國有 15 隻大熊貓,但在過去十年間,隨著中美關係的惡化,數量已經下降,現在國家動物園的三隻大熊貓即將離開,這將使得亞特蘭大動物園成為美國唯一擁有大熊貓的動物園。

目前為止,亞特蘭大最後四隻大熊貓的合同明年到期,尚無任何續約的消息。

而這可能意味著到 2024 年底,美洲所有動物園中唯一的大熊貓將是墨西哥城的辛辛。

中國還將新的大熊貓租借給其他國家,包括歐盟國家如丹麥、芬蘭和德國,在中東;卡達去年獲得了他們的第一隻大熊貓。這些都是中國期望加強關係並增加影響力的地區。國家動物園的工作人員希望中國有一天能再次送來更多的大熊貓。他們甚至計劃翻新即將空置的大熊貓展區。
