一場處於人工智慧 (AI) 產業核心、備受矚目的法庭訴訟案已落下帷幕。加州陪審團認定伊隆·馬斯克 (Elon Musk) 等待了太久才起訴他於 2015 年協助創立的 OpenAI，因此判決馬斯克敗訴。我們的記者哈達斯·高德 (Hadas Gold) 將帶來更多報導，分析這項判決對這位全球首富以及這家地球上最有價值的科技公司之一意味著什麼。

在經過科技界幾位大咖長達三週的證詞辯論後，加州陪審團花了不到兩個小時的時間，就對馬斯克控告 OpenAI 及其領導人山姆·阿特曼 (Sam Altman) 的重大訴訟案做出判決。陪審團基本上認為馬斯克太晚提起這項訴訟——也就是說，法律規定的「訴訟時效 (追訴期) 」已經過了。

曾協助出資並共同創立 OpenAI 的伊隆·馬斯克提起訴訟，聲稱自己受到欺騙、該公司領導人獲取不正當利益，並且在將 OpenAI 從純粹的非營利組織轉型為營利性架構時，違反了慈善信託。現在，該公司是一家由非營利基金會董事會監管的營利性企業，也是科技界最具價值的公司之一。

OpenAI 在辯護中則反駁，伊隆·馬斯克長期以來一直希望 OpenAI 擁有某種營利架構，以協助籌集資金來支應昂貴的 AI 開發成本。他們表示，當馬斯克無法如願掌控 OpenAI 時，他便於 2018 年離開了公司，隨後出資創立了競爭對手——他的 xAI 公司。OpenAI 主張，這根本就是有人試圖想要擊垮競爭對手的案例。

不過對 OpenAI 來說，這意味著他們目前的計畫可以如願繼續進行。他們預計在今年稍晚進行大規模的首次公開募股 (IPO)。在這場官司中，馬斯克曾希望法官能將 OpenAI 恢復為非營利狀態，如果他成功了，顯然會打亂 OpenAI 的所有計畫。他還希望山姆·阿特曼丟掉工作。但至少在目前，隨著馬斯克提出上訴，這些事情都不會發生。
