今天我們首先要來看一個結合了學業、移民以及用非常規方式緩解恐懼的故事。全美各地有些學校受聯邦移民執法行動的影響比其他學校更為嚴重。在紐約皇后區，阿特拉斯高中（Atlas High School）的校長梅斯曼（Mesman）女士估計，校內超過半數的學生正處於取得合法身分的過程中。近來，入學人數正在下降，缺席率也在上升，校長表示，這很可能是因為學生擔心在獲得正式文件前就被驅逐出境。因此，教職員採取了行動。一間教室變成了美甲技術訓練中心，一間儲藏室則變成了拳擊健身房。學校創造了這些空間，讓學生可以學習一技之長、建立自信，並為未來的生活做好準備——無論他們是回到家鄉還是獲得公民身分。記者漢娜·凱澤（Hannah Kaiser）帶來的報導。

「當你在健身房時，你有什麼感覺？」「有一點腎上腺素飆升，而且覺得很快樂。」這是蓋布莉艾拉（Gabriella）。她是皇后區阿特拉斯高中的高二學生，那裡有很多像她一樣的近期移民。她說她在 13 歲時從薩爾瓦多移居美國。「你知道那種『移民憂鬱症』，每個人都有，因為我在紐約待了五年，我還是有一種感覺，覺得我的生活還留在故鄉，但我知道事實並非如此。」

該校的學生人數今年減少了約 40%，主要是因為全國各地的移民執法行動。基於這個原因，我們隱藏了學生的身分。「大家快點，走吧。」鐘聲響了。孩子們上學的頻率變低了。我想部分原因是——他們在通學路上感到不安全。而且因為他們覺得自己很快就會面臨被驅逐出境，他們可能沒有真正投入到受教育的過程中，因為他們選擇去工作。

拳擊計畫是學校為了激勵學生繼續上學而設立的眾多計畫之一。其他還有美甲技術、理髮、攝影、硬體與軟體技術。這些類型的課程是學生感興趣的項目，也是我們的學生在取得身分的過程中，可以賴以謀生的技能。

拳擊計畫為他們帶來了慰藉與舒適感。今年，負責拳擊健身房的教練麥克·菲格羅亞（Mike Figueroa）設計了一套課程，讓學生可以受訓成為認證教練來賺錢。「很好。加油。四、五、六。」不過，當蓋布莉艾拉想像自己在拳擊界的未來時，她想做的不是教練或訓練員，而是親自上場比賽。「我的目標是有一天能打一場職業賽。我會想像我的媽媽、哥哥、表親、阿姨們，我是說，我所有的家人都在現場。我對自己的飲食非常嚴格，因為那是我的夢想。啊，做得好。」
